Court Appointed Special Advocates of Central Texas (CASA) is challenging the community to turn Monday's Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Service into the start of a lifelong difference for abused and neglected children.

Each year, more than 700 children enter the region's overburdened welfare system, CASA reports. Last year, less than half of those children had CASA volunteers to help guide them through the system and into safe, loving homes. The volunteers are trained members of the community who provide a voice for these children and work to serve their best interest in court.

"Reverend King said, 'Everybody can be great because anybody can serve,' and that's true with CASA," said Norma Blackwell, CASA executive director. "CASA volunteers are teachers, business people, parents and grandparents. They are everyday people who do extraordinary work for our most vulnerable children in our community."

Every child in foster care needs a CASA volunteer who will ensure they do not slip through the cracks but instead find a loving home where they can grow and flourish.

Last year, CASA served more than 400 children in Caldwell, Comal, Guadalupe and Hays counties but there were still many children who didn't have the voice of a CASA volunteer.
